Michael Nevradakis

Dr. Michael Nevradakis (Ph.D., Media Studies, The University of Texas at Austin, 2018) is an instructor in communication at Deree-The American College of Greece and at New York College, both based in Athens. His research interests focus on social and new media and their impact on the public sphere, the Greek media landscape, media and telecommunications policy, alternative and community media, global and international media, the media industry, communications technology and society, radio studies, and diaspora media. Nevradakis' research has been published in the *Journal of Radio and Audio Media*, *The Global Media Journal-Canadian Edition*, and in *The Palgrave Handbook of Global Radio*, while publication of his new book based on the findings of his dissertation research is forthcoming. His dissertation, titled "From The Polis to Facebook: Social Media and the Development of a New Greek Public Sphere," drew upon multi-year research performed on the ground in Greece, including over 120 interviews, examining the impact of social and new media on the public sphere, civil society, and public discourse in Greece during the country's economic crisis. Nevradakis has been a Fulbright scholar and has received funding for his research from the Alexander S. Onassis Foundation, the Greek State Scholarships Foundation, and the Erasmus+ program, in addition to a Dissertation Grant from Phi Kappa Phi. Nevradakis is also active as a media practitioner, as producer and host of Dialogos Radio and as an independent journalist and radio manager/producer.
