She recently won the Karl Popper Prize for her published undergraduate thesis "Punishment & Power: An Examination of the European Union's Use of Lawfare Since 1993" and was awarded "Best in International Relations" at her university's 2018 research symposium. She's presented at numerous additional conferences including the National Conference of Undergraduate Research (NCUR) at the University of Memphis in 2017 and the 2018 NCUR at University of Central Oklahoma.

Morgan spent two years conducting research at a DC-based national security and foreign policy think tank and spent a year organizing cultural diplomacy presentations in Russia through the U.S Department of State.
